# 1 Identify Concerns

# What is a concern?

A feeling that you need to do something...

Fix a problem Make sure an action or plan works Make a choice Understand unclear issues

A concern can be a single issue or a group of issues Different types of concerns require different approaches

When to use Situation Appraisal? Are any of the concerns facing us unclear? Is the number of concerns facing us overwhelming?

Are we unclear in which order to address the concerns? Are we unclear about how to resolve the concerns?

Yes to any of the above = use Situation Appraisal

### **Identify the theme**

What are the primary areas of concern? What boundaries will help focus our attention and resources? What is the theme for this Situation Appraisal?

### List concerns

What deviations are occurring? What decisions need to be made? What plans should be implemented?

What changes are anticipated? What threats exist? What opportunities exist? What else?

### Separate and clarify concerns

### Separate

Is there more than one issue in this concern? What's the evidence? What else concerns us about ...?

Can this concern be resolved by a single analysis or action? What's the evidence?

#### Clarify

What exactly do we mean by ...?

What exactly is ...?

### **Create action statements**

Does each separated and clarified concern indicate the action needed to resolve it?

Is the action about a deviation, a choice, a threat, or an opportunity?

Do we simply need to get something done?

If the action is not clear, rewrite the concern as a...

Problem Statement (object and deviation)

Decision Statement (choice word, result, and modifiers)

Potential Problem Statement (action or plan that needs protecting and end result) Potential Opportunity Statement (action or plan that needs leveraging and end result) Situation Theme Statement (a separate category of concerns that need appraising)

If the action required is still unclear, separate and clarify further

# **Set Priority**

### Use knowledge and experience

Which concerns should we work on first?

If clear, or if immediate action is needed, set the priority order: Examine the list of action statements

Identify those to address immediately and those to delay Mark the highest priority concerns with asterisks (\*)

If unclear, or if you cannot agree on priority order, use current impact, future impact, and time frame

\* Superior solution?

\* Approval?

\* Development?

\* Commitment?

# Use current impact, future impact, and time frame

Current impact = actual impact up until this moment on people, safety, cost, customers, productivity, reputation, etc.

Future impact = anticipated impact from this moment forward, if left unresolved, on people, safety, cost, customers, productivity, reputation, etc.

Time frame = deadline (clock and calendar time) after which resolution will become difficult, expensive, impossible, or meaningless to resolve

What is the current impact of this concern not being resolved?

What will be the future impact if this is left unresolved?

What is the time frame (specific time or date) when this will become difficult, expensive, impossible, or meaningless to resolve?

Confirm and record specific, supporting data for current impact, future impact, and time frame
